

There are no cookie cutters that shape us. When we think of the Emmaus weekend experience we realize that we cannot lock the weekend into a militaristic. precision, lockstep process. Sure there are things that need to be accomplished and a time agenda that gets us from one place to another and from one talk to another. But in between we find that things happen which make the weekend "the best weekend ever for the best walk ever" This is what the team is called upon to foster.

Gentleness is that way that we approach life. We look back at grandparents and realize that they showed us the best of all worlds because they represent gentleness. My

memories of them hold only the best of life experiences. I learned a lot from my parents that I need to continue to make my life disciplined, but there are also things I learned from my father, especially, that I had to make sure I don't do. My two boys had opportunities and experiences, like some from my childhood, which initiated a phase of being "grounded for life". But in reflective gentleness "grounded for life" did not last very long and surely not eternity. I think we each learn a lot from our grandparents and parents, some of which we do not plan on carrying down to the next generation.

Gentleness is a spirit that prevails in our life experience. How I talk to others, how I make lasting decisions with my partner in life, how I choose? All of these bring out the gentleness that has been given to me by the grace of God and which his love calls for me to pass on in my relationships. Gentleness is caring for the other. It is a beginning to move us on toward Agape love. Gentleness is responsiveness from the power of love and not from the power of position.

The gentleness that we learn from our parents, from interactions in the church we participate in, and from our social contacts does much to humanize each of us. **Gentleness** arises out of a blend between firmness and flexibility. Another popular song for our reflection is "Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness" which calls us to feel the presence of the Christ in our life and blow that spirit through each endeavor that we make. It is what makes us a "follower of the Christ".


