
Windmill Emmaus.

Edward Winslow was one of the first pilgrims to the new world, known as the Americas. The year was 1621, and the first fall crops were now harvested. This small group of Christians invited the 91 Wampanoag natives to celebrate. Edward Winslow wrote to family in England, "And God be praised, we had a good increase.... Our harvest being gotten in, our governor sent four men on fowling that so we might after a special manner rejoice together.... These things I thought good to let you understand... that you might on our behalf give God thanks who hath dealt so favourably with us."

Yes, these pilgrims celebrated for three days! These men and women of faith rejoiced and they gave thanks to God! They paused in their joy and turned their hearts to the Lord. Their example offers to us some questions: Do we praise God? And what do we thank God for in our lives?
