

Faithfulness is another great gift to exemplify in our lives. We might think that it means that we are faithful to our spouse, family, our, or our job. These are all great choices and necessary in communal relationships, but we must first of all be faithful to God. Without this, as first priority, we are preparing ourselves for failure in all of the other necessary places of faithfulness. How many times in our lives do we put the cart before the horse? Too many! God calls us to relationship with him and with the greater Church community. The Presbyterian Women of the Church Bible Study looked in November at a passage from 2 Corinthians in which the Old and New Covenants were being compared in terms of ecumenical openness to all denominational expressions of the One God we worship. Faithfully we are to work

with, rather than contrary to, other church bodies in our communities.

We enter into a covental relationship with God in which he gives all to us and gives us grace and mercy inspite of our sinful nature (lack of faithfulness). Each day because of what God has initiated for us we return faithfulness to God and this opens us up in all other relationships so we can be Faithful in all things both great and small.

When I was an Army Chaplain we had the opportunity as chaplains to bring entertainers to minister to the service members whom God had faithfully brought to us. One such entertainer came to the post I was stationed at and introduced me to a hymn that was new to my Lutheran awareness back in the late 1970's. The hymn is entitled, Great is Thy Faithfulness. That song pretty well somes it up, "Great is Thy Faithfulness, O God, My Father, There is no shadow of turning with Thee; Thou changest not, thy compassions they fail not, As Thou hast been Thou forever will be."

That hymn finally made it into Lutheran worship with our binder hymnal, This Far By Faith. Old dogs can learn new tricks and Great is thy faithfulness is now among my favorite hymns of the Church.
