
Happy August Windmill,

Grace and peace be unto you from our Savior, Jesus the Christ. Amen

The Psalms are a blessing from the Lord. Early each day, I explore the psalms and the message God offers to us. The message is as simple as "Praise the LORD!" (Psalm 150:1). We asked to be appreciative to our God, "I give you thanks, O LORD" (Psalm 138:1).

There is a common theme weaving through the Psalms. It is the theme of goodness found in God's Law. The psalmist scribes, "33 Teach me, O LORD, the way of your statutes; and I will keep it to the end. 34 Give me understanding, that I may keep your law and observe it with my whole heart. ³⁵ Lead me in the path of your commandments, for I delight in it. 36 Incline my heart to your testimonies, and not to selfish gain!' (Psalm 119). Unlike our culture seeking to demonize God's law for self-interest. We discover again and again praise for, support to, and even guidance from the law. Yes, it is true that God gifts us with the law, but not for the purpose of salvation, read Romans. Instead, God blesses us with the law to guide in relationship building.

Let us consider relationships without the laws of God and without divine guidance. In an anything goes relationship we tend to say and do anything we want. The concern is self-interest focusing of self-gain. These me-myselfand-I relationships end badly. We are talking major crashing and burning. Others are not interested in propping up people filled with self-importance.

God's divine guidance through the law addresses the relationship based in sacrificial love.
