

When my oldest daughter was young she did a science fair project on soil samples from the salt flats of the Bahia Grande in South Texas. I was an assistant on this project which meant that I gathered materials such as ziplock bags, a sharpie, a ruler and a kitchen spoon for digging down in the sand. We had our tools for the job.

As she started to dig with the kitchen spoon, she made it about half an inch down before she hit clay. The spoon handle bent as we tried to dig in the clay. We found out we didn't bring the right tools.

The Bahia Grande was once a fertile fish and shrimp incubator where the Rio Grande pours into the Gulf of Mexico. When the ship channel was being built in the 1950's, Bahia Grande was cut off from the supply of fresh water. The fish and shrimp searching for fertile waters out of harm's way no longer had a place to go. Eventually the area dried up, leaving behind nothing but salty wasteland covering the clay basin.

In Luke 6 Jesus is talking to his disciples about the foundations we build our life

Are you connecting to the living water of Christ found in walking alongside fellow pilgrims needing a safe place to incubate?

As disciples we need to dig down to the solid ground, we need to be connected to streams of Living Water found in both hearing and doing God's word.
