Greetings and God's Blessings to All

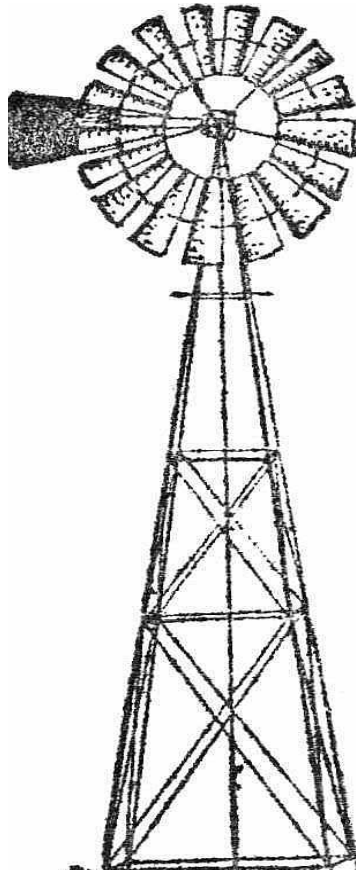
