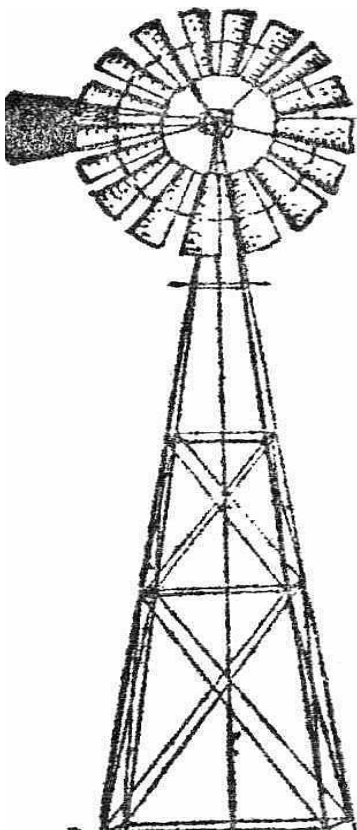
Greetings and God's Blessings to all:
