To Stay Closed Down or Not to Stay Closed Down, That is the Question

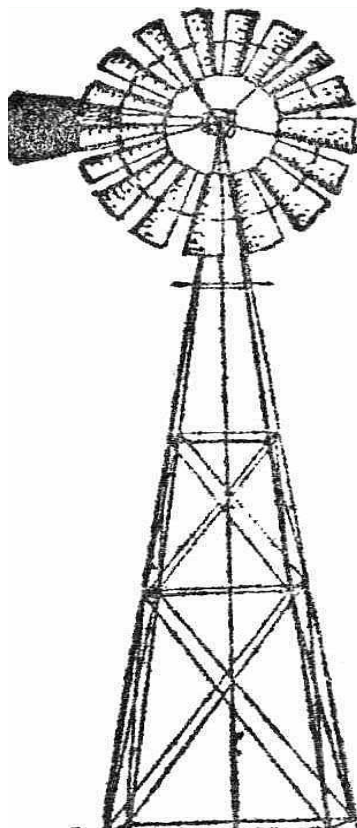
Romans 13:1 (NIV)
