is like a driving rain that leaves no crops.

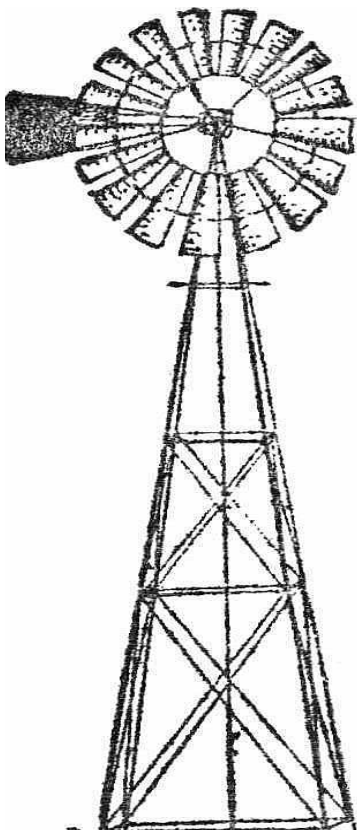
⁴ Those who forsake instruction praise the wicked,
