


Hello to all my brothers and sisters in Christ!

For those of you who don't, God promised Abraham and Sarah a son, and after 40 years of waiting, they had Isaac. There is a whole lot more to this story, but I am going to keep my focus on the sacrificial part of it. I don't know how old Isaac was when God asked Abraham to go sacrifice him, but I know he was old enough to help carry the wood and he was old enough to ask his dad where the lamb was. Abraham obeyed God and trusted God. He built the altar, laid the wood in order, and bound his son Isaac and laid him on the alter on top of the wood. Just as Abraham was fixing to sacrifice Isaac, the angel of the Lord called to him and told him not to lay a hand on the boy. Abraham lifted his eyes and saw a ram caught in a thicket by his horns. God provided the ram to take the place of Isaac.

I would like to say I would be as obedient as Abraham, but I have a hard time believing I could be. I cannot even begin to imagine how Abraham must have felt and what courage it must have taken to be obedient. Abraham named that place Jehovah-Jireh – The Lord saw…and the Lord provided.
