

Walk #75 will be my 15th Walk to work. One other time, I went on the Walk and had to go home Friday morning because I injured my back. I will never forget the two walks I missed as much as the fifteen walks the Lord has blessed me to work because of how much I love Emmaus and it breaks my heart when I am not there!

I would like to remind every one what a blessing it is to go on a pilgrim Walk, sponsor a pilgrim, or to work a Walk as part of the Inside or Outside Teams. As we stated at the last Gathering at the First United Methodist Church in Beeville in May, that the prices of sponsoring a pilgrim and/ or working a walk beginning in April 2024 with Walk #76 may need to be raised to \$280. a person, respectively. This is approximately a \$3,000. increase in charges being made by Camp Zephyr. That increase will translate to be a \$40.00 increase per person. As a person who loves Emmaus, I would never want to get to the place where persons cannot afford to work a Walk or to sponsor a pilgrim. Of course, this stems from Zephyr having to charge us more for electricity, food, paper goods, and their employees' salaries because their prices have gone up just like ours have.

As a Board, we even discussed moving to a different site other than Camp Zephyr, but then we would entail travel costs to and from, also. Camp Zephyr is set up to meet all our needs and we would like to continue to host our walks there! Please consider helping us sustain the Windmill Walk to Emmaus as we all know and love it and in praying that we will be able to do so! If God is nudging your heart and you are financially able to be a tremendous blessing to us, your gift would be greatly appreciated by everyone associated with Emmaus in any way!
