
Greetings Brothers and Sisters:

support our new pilgrims! Attending most monthly Gatherings (I think I have missed 3 or 4 in the last twelve years because of work, being ill, or one of my cats needing extra care) makes my heart so joyful. I truly love all my Emmaus Friends. I love worshipping together. I love hearing the Word and partaking of the Lord's supper together. I will have to say that I do enjoy the meals and the fellowship. I love to be involved in a big or small way in all of the Walks. I love attending Candlelight and Closing at the end of each Walk. I love getting to meet new people who become friends.

I really believe in my heart that Emmaus is and should be an extension of our individual churches and that we should treat it as such. Once again, I am encouraging your attendance. I am encouraging you to invite and bring an Emmaus friend to the Gatherings. We all need to look around and see if the pilgrims that we once sponsored are in attendance. Windmill Emmaus had had 73 Walks since our founding and first Walk in Oct. 1992 which means that we have had 73 Walk Lay Directors. I know that some of these Lay Directors' have gone to be with the Lord now and some have moved too far away to travel to a Gathering on a Thursday night. I have been very involved in Emmaus for the last twelve years and I have never met some of the persons listed as Lay Director on some walks. I challenge and encourage all past Lay Directors to look around and see if the pilgrims from the Walk God called you to lead are in attendance. What about your Team members? Are they in attendance? If you personally know a past Lay Director and he or she is not in attendance, please contact them and try to encourage them to join us again. If you calculate 73 Walks multiplied by an average number of 30 pilgrims you get 2190 plus or minus people. I know that we send the Breeze out to over 500 people each month. Where are the other 1, 690 people? Many Emmaus members have slipped away for one reason or another. I think we need to get together and find out why that are not active. During the Closing Ceremony after each Walk, pilgrims stand up and share how the Walk has made a huge impact on and in their specific lives. Where are they now?

The author of the Book of Hebrews refers to encouragement and meeting together in the following verses: "¹⁹ Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching". Hebrews 10: 19-25

In closing, I encourage you all to encourage others to come to the Gatherings. At the last Gathering in Taft in August 2023, we had 73 people in attendance. If all 73 people invite and bring one person, we would have 156 people in attendance! Who will you invite and bring with you to George West in Sept.? This Gathering will be Team Consecration for the Women's Walk # 75. We need you there!

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What To Know About Sponsoring A Pilgrim

SPONSORSHIP

Without sponsors, there will be no pilgrims! So thank you for taking on the responsibility to sponsor a pilgrim for a walk.

A sponsor should commit to recruiting strong church leaders in order to strengthen the local church, and hopefully to become leaders of our Emmaus Community.

Being a sponsor has a lot of responsibilities...the first is to spend LOTS OF TIME IN PRAYER! God has already revealed the name of the pilgrim HE has chosen for you to sponsor, and pray for that pilgrim before, during and after their Walk.

After you've talked to your prospective pilgrim, give them an application to complete.

LETTERS: Begin getting addresses for their agape letters.

Stay in touch with your pilgrim, and make sure they know you're there to support them. Remind them of the things they need to pack.

AGAPE: You as a sponsor should take your pilgrims favorite drink and some sort of food agape and/or other agape.

Day of the Walk: Pick up your pilgrim with plenty of time to take them to eat and then on to the Walk site and help them get settled in.

After the Lay Director calls the pilgrims together, you will soon go to the Chapel for sponsors hour. It's important that you attend this time of worship. It is there that you will pray with your pilgrims lanyard and hang it on the cross that will be presented to them at the end of their walk.

CANDLELIGHT: You are to attend the Candlelight Service on Saturday night. Bring any late letters you may get for your pilgrims. Here once again you may have the opportunity to pray with your pilgrims cross. Candlelight is one of the most moving events of the Walk.

CLOSING: You are to come to closing and your pilgrim's spouse is invited to come as well. We know how excited you are to hear ALL about it.

But remember your responsibilities do not end at the closing...it is your responsibility to get your new pilgrim to gatherings and try to help them find a reunion group.

Encourage them to make agape for future walks, or even sign up to work a team or help where ever needed.

Your final responsibility is to TEACH THEM TO BE A GOOD SPONSOR, by helping them understand the responsibilities of what a good sponsor does. The best way to do this is by example.

4th Day Talk Guidelines

Please accept the sincere thanks of the Windmill Emmaus community for agreeing to give the 4th Day Talk!

We believe God will bless you as you prepare for your talk and the community will be blessed by the words you are led to share. The guidelines that follow are intended to assist in your preparation.

Your talk should be no longer than 10 minutes in length. It should cover one experience or idea and not a long list of experiences. It is a talk about Your 4th Day (your post-Emmaus journey with the Lord). Your talk should be a personal story, stated honestly, at your normal talking speed, and presented in a "down to earth" manner. • Your talk might tell how the Walk changed the way you serve God in your church or community. • It might tell how the way you see God or have experienced His love and power in your own life has changed after the Walk. • It might tell a specific way in which you have tried to help someone know God's love. • It might talk about a recent experience and how you have seen and felt God's presence. • It might tell how you have seen God's presence in another person and what that means to you. • It might tell how your 4th Day Reunion group helped you keep God at the center of your life.

Remember, you have 10 minutes, choose one or two topics wisely, speak naturally, avoid speaking fast to make your talk fit the limit. And most importantly, go to the Lord in prayer seeking His guidance in choosing your topic.

The 4th Day Talk should not be a sermon, instruction on Christianity or a Bible teaching, and should not try to justify a specific doctrinal position. Try to avoid talking about the specific details of an Emmaus weekend – we often have visitors at Gatherings who have not attended a Walk.

You can use the following self-test to confirm that your talk is on track; you should be able to answer "**Yes**" to all of these questions.

- Does this talk show that Jesus Christ is in my life?
- Will it show how much I want to follow Jesus?
- Does Jesus himself hold the most important place in the talk?

• Will my talk stimulate people to think of things they might plan to do to transform their home, work, church, recreation or environment for Christ?

Before the Gathering, have a friend or group of friends agree to be your prayer partner(s). Meet with them before your talk and have them pray for God's presence while you are talking.

We believe that God has blessed your life and that He will be present with you as you prepare and present your 4th Day Talk.
