Emmaus Family,

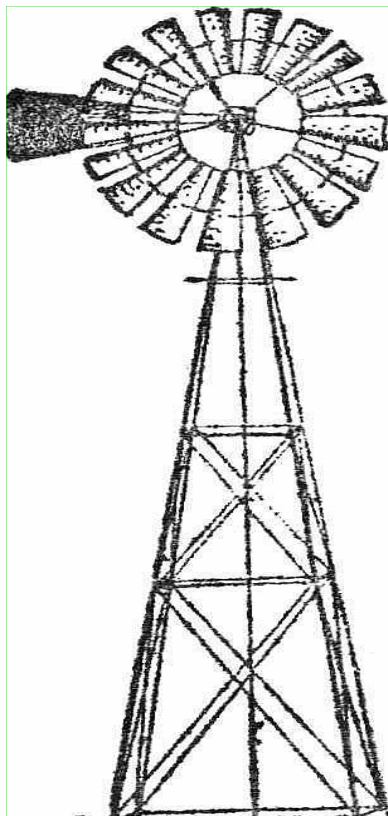
Here's wishing all our Emmaus moms a belated happy and blessed Mother's Day.

There was a good turnout of the Windmill Emmaus Walk #76 new members at the May gathering and a good turnout of the Windmill Community.

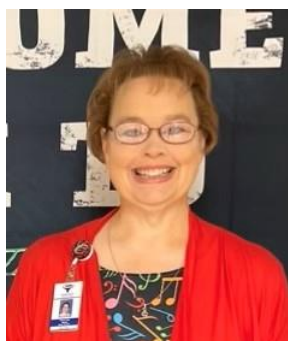
